White Wine

Paracombe Pinot Gris, Adelaide Hills *Adelaide Hills, South Australia*

Bottle £41.50

This wine has a great textural quality in the mouth with an attractive bouquet of pear and rose petal. The palate gives fresh flavours of nectarine, pear and crème caramel with flinty mineral notes on the finish.

Knightor Carpe Diem St Austell, Cornwall

Bottle £33.50

Fresh, easy drinking wine made with Huxelrebe, Bacchus, Reichensteiner and Chardonnay. Displays delicate fresh fruit and floral hedgerow characters on the nose.

Bethany g6 Riesling, Barossa Valley, Australia

Bottle £28

A classic style from one of Australia's premium Riesling sites. The very attractive brilliant pale green-gold colour and varietal citrus aromas lead on to a lean, refined lemony palate with delicate floral overtones. The finish is clean and crisp with good acid balance and length.

Knightor, Mena Hweg Cornwall, England

Bottle £39.50

We have derived our name from the Cornish translation for the grape Schonburger, which means 'pretty/sweet hill'. Mena = hill, Hweg = nice/sweet. The wine is a light green in the glass with delicate floral, citrus and peach like aromas.

Oakridge Local Vineyard Series Chardonnay, Yarra Valley, Australia

Bottle £55

The grapes are whole bunch pressed directly to oak puncheons and fermented with natural yeasts. The palate is rich, almost opulent with a fruit salad, green melon, quince and toffee apple character, supported by a fine, long acidity and strong citrus tang.

Kung Fu girl Riesling, Washington State

Bottle £46

Yet another terrific vintage. Pure, focused and mouth-watering. Citrus blossom, lime leaf, white peach intermingle with mineral that fills the palate and carries on to a long refreshing finish.



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Red Wine

Beaujolais-Villages, Pascal Clément Burgundy, France

Bottle £33

Beaujolais Villages makes up about 25% of all wines produced in the region,. Cherry-red, fresh and bursting with red and bramble fruit on the nose, the palate is relatively soft.

Chapel Down Union Red Kent, England

Bottle £38.95

A blend of Rondo and Pinot Noir; Rondo is an unusual early ripening red variety which thrives in England's cooler climate. Its union with the classic Pinot Noir grape produces attractive cherry and strawberry flavours in a light refreshing red.

Son Excellence Cabernet Sauvignon, Languedoc-Roussillon, France

Bottle £19.95

Dark purple, showing blackcurrant and bramble fruit aromas and a light hint of green pepper; smooth and fruity with a hint of pepper on the finish.

Salentein Barrel Selection Cabernet Sauvignon, Mendoza, Argentina

Bottle £32.50

Ruby-red wine with good aromatic intensity, touches of roasted red pepper followed by a sweetness given by the red and black fruits and vanilla from ageing in French and American oak barrels. Round, soft palate, well-structured with fine tannins and generous fruit flavours.

La Closerie de Camensac, Haut-Médoc, Bordeaux, France

Bottle £41.95

La Closerie de Camensac is the second wine of Château Camensac. The vineyards are situated at the edge of the Saint-Julien appellation, in the commune of Saint-Laurent-Médoc.

Don Jacabo Rioja Crianza, Spain

Bottle £26.50

A traditional red Rioja very much in Bodegas Corral's style, matured for a minimum of 12 months in American oak followed by at least a year in bottle before release. A blend of 90% Tempranillo with small additions of Garnacha and Mazuelo varieties.

Baron de Brane, Margaux Bordeaux, France

Bottle £75.95

Baron de Brane is the second wine of Château Brane-Cantenac, a second growth château owned by Henri Lurton and one of the oldest and largest properties in Margaux. The blend is made up of about 60% Cabernet Sauvignon and 40% Merlot.

Baigorri Rioja Reserva Rioja, Spain

Bottle £54.50

The Tempranillo grapes for this Reserva comes from old vines with low yields, Dark concentrated cherry-red wine, lively and potent nose with leather, liquorice and black pepper aromas mingling with fresh, ripe red and black fruit; full-bodied with an elegant tannin structure and finish.

Sierra Cantabria Rioja, Spain

Bottle £35

Sierra Cantabria's most widely-admired wine due to its incredible value and delicate but complex style. Ripe cherry and red fruit, hints of spice and smoke, and a dusting of cocoa combine to form an elegant, complex Rioja with layers of oak and fruit

Enrico Serafino Barbera D'Alba, Italy

Bottle £28.50

Surrounded by some of Italy's most famous wine regions, the town of Alba, also the centre of the Italian truffle trade, sits in the centre of the Barbera d'Alba region. The Barbera grapes undergo a moderately long fermentation and the wine is aged in large oak barrels. Garnet-red, with a dry, quite full-bodied palate, it shows cherry, currant and spice.



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Sparkling Wine, Champagne & Cider

Fowey Valley Sparkling Vintage Cider, Golant, Cornwall

Bottle £25

Sparkling Vintage Cider is made with a high proportion of dessert apples in the mix to give it that delicious 'méthode traditionnelle' taste. We don't use any sulphites or other preservatives. The apples are just pressed, then fermented twice: first in the barrel for a year; then a second year's fermentation in the bottle. The cider is then disgorged in the champagne style and aged further before release. It is the secondary fermentation that gives our cider its wonderful bubbly effervescence; a method invented in the West Country for fine cider making around 1600, well before it was used in France for Champagne. Won silver at the 2015 British Cider championships. Gold at Taste of the West.

Knightor Classic Cuvee St Austell, Cornwall

Bottle £45.50

Pale lemon green in colour with a lively mousse that quickly settles to a steady stream of fine bubbles. Aromas are wonderfully fresh, floral and fruity, dominated by elderflower, honeysuckle, pear and peach. On the palate, this wine shows great vivacity, with good acidity balanced by delicate fruit flavours and a fine mousse, leading to a clean and crisp finish. Serve at 8 degrees

Duval Leroy Brut Reserve Champagne, France

Bottle £39.50

A fresh, modern, stylish Champagne made using mainly Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier plus 10% Chardonnay. The grapes are drawn from 15 crus, and there is a generous addition of reserve wines. The wine was the only Champagne selected by the 'Wine Spectator' in its 'Annual Round-up of the Year's Most Exciting Wines 2008'. Shows a youthful, mineral palate with a fresh-fruit character which is beautifully woven into the finish.

Moët & Chandon Brut Rose Champagne, France

Bottle £65

Pink in colour with amber highlights, a lively intense bouquet of red fruits, floral nuances of rose and a slight hint of pepper. An expressive palate combining intensity and suppleness of ripe berry flavours and fleshiness and firmness of peach.

Moët & Chandon Grande Vintage 2008 Champagne, France

Bottle £80

Bright pale yellow with glimmers of green. Fine, dynamic bead. Initial floral notes of linden, honeysuckle and acacia with citrus nuances evocative of bergamot and mandarin orange zest along with a dash of anise and green tomato. Following are notes of just-ripe stone fruits—white peach, nectarine and Mirabelle plums. The bouquet is completed by gentle scents of pastry, brioche, frangipane, almonds and vanilla with a slight hint of white pepper.

Laurent Perrier Ultra Brut NV Champagne, France

Bottle £140

Very pale and crystal-bright in colour. Intense and complex on the nose, with a wide range of aromas, including citrus and white fruit and flowers, such as honeysuckle. The combined effect gives off an impression of freshness, much like ocean air. Airy and delicate upon entry, yet surprisingly long. Floral and fruit flavours combine with mineral notes to give a wine that is pure without being austere. The finish is long and leaves the palate clean.



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
